<p>Make a car park, with numbered parking spaces to 20. Play a game, giving instructions such as “park the red car (or a different toy) on the number that is one more than 15” etc..</p>	<p>Practise writing all of the long letters. Remember to start at the top and take your pen off of the paper to dot the heads after. Can you write some long letter words?</p> 	<p>Cut some different fruit vegetables in half and have a go at printing with them using paint. Can you make a <a href="#">repeating pattern</a> with the shapes? Or create a picture?</p> 	<p>Discover what happens when you put a flower into water that you've coloured with food dye. What do you think will happen?</p> 	<p> Spruce up a standard <a href="#">playdough recipe</a> by adding herbs, flowers or lavender to it. Create different combinations of smells.</p>
<p>Play a game of <a href="#">Would You Rather?</a> For example, would you rather ride a T-Rex or a Pterodactyl? Can you talk about why you chose that option?</p>	<p>With an adult, set up a <a href="#">'laser' obstacle course</a> using tape or string. Can you get from one side to the other without touching them? Make it harder by putting them closer together!</p>	<p>Design your own smoothies by mixing real fruit, and juices – what's your favourite? Can you taste all the flavours you added? Make them into milkshakes by adding milk or ice cream</p>	<p><a href="#">Watch live webcams</a> of animals in Africa. What animals can you spot? Can you find out more about them? Can you make an information poster?</p>	<p>The stories on your bookshelves are a great resource. Maybe pick one you haven't read in a while and see if it offers any good ideas or making or play.</p>
<p>If you have an old magazine or catalogue, carefully cut out and stick pictures that you like to make a collage. Can you talk about why you picked those pictures?</p>	<p> Take part in these <a href="#">fun action songs</a> to get yourself moving to the rhythm!</p>	<p>Draw a picture of your favourite story. Can your family guess what story it is? What details will you need?</p> 	<p>Before you go on your next walk, talk about something you might see i.e. dogs, birds, horses. Write them down and add a tally mark each time you spot one.</p>	<p>If you have Lego, Duplo or another construction toy at home, have a go at making a maze or a marble run for your family to try.</p>
<p>Which super power would you have if you could pick any. Would you be invisible, super fast, super strong or would you pick a different one like stretchy fingers? What would you do with your powers?</p>	<p>Make a string of friends by folding a piece of paper into four sections and cutting out the shape of a person. Unfold your paper and decorate each person.</p> 	<p>Make your own musical instrument with recycled tubing/rice/lentils/elastic bands. Can you tap or twang to the rhythm of your favourite song?</p> 	<p>Play a scavenger hunt inside the house. You could make up your own list of things to find or have a go at <a href="#">this one</a>.</p>	<p>Salt has some interesting effects on other materials. Try making salt water and painting it on to paper. Or sprinkle some onto ice and see what happens. Oil, water and salt makes a great lava lamp.</p>
