Hi everyone!

We hope you enjoyed the mini-heatwave this week. Sunny weather is a great opportunity to discuss sun safety with your child and, in these new circumstances, ways to stay safe when out and about. You could even make little poster reminders to go by the front door - 'get a hat!' or 'have you got cream on?'. In school we've been enjoying lots of water play and finding ways to stay cool, paper fans and sitting under the big tree are two favourites. On Friday you will find out your child's class teacher for next year and rest assured we will find ways to make transition as smooth as we possibly can. For now, continue to work on those key phonics skills and explore meaningful ways for your child to learn.

**Home Learning Tip:** Turn learning sessions into a game! If you're practising doubling try dealing out 5 playing cards to your child and 5 cards for yourself (no pictures or 7s or 9s). Then take it turns to look for doubles in each other's hands - e.g. "I have a 2. Double 2 is 4 so I'm taking your 4!" If no one can make a match you both draw another card. You can play with halves as well.

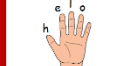
## Writing in Reception
