Home learning suggestions:

If your child is starting school in September, West Sussex provide this helpful guide with activities that you can do together to help them prepare for school.



Encourage problem solving by providing sheets, pegs and furniture (inside or out). Can they make their own tent? How will they make it stay up?

Take a walk down to the beach when the tide is low. Can you draw your family in the sand? What about some of the letters from your name? Can you find any special shells in the sand?



Have a go at making up your own story. Who is going to be in your story? What will happen? You could use these story prompts to help you think of different ideas. They are free to access. You just need to sign up.

Put on a show for your family and have a go at remembering all of our Rhyme Time Challenges over the year. Do you remember the words to Jelly on a Plate? How about Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear?
